PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Preparing for 2019

We are at the time of year where we identify leadership and teaching positions for 2019 as well as reviewing curriculum and seeing what, if any, changes we might make.

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From 2019 we are formalising how we arrange our organisational structure as we move to a Preschool to Year 6 and Year 7 to Year 12 model within our P-12 School. We are also working on programming to move Year 7 students more into the secondary timetabling process.

We have recently advertised many leadership positions to support this and we will also have a number of new permanent teacher positions too as our school continues to grow with increasing enrolment demand.

From 2019 we are introducing an Outdoor Education subject offering and maintaining all other subject offerings from this year.

NAPLAN Online

In Week 5 this term some of our students will participate in trial NAPLAN tests using computers online. This is in readiness for 2019 when the paper based NAPLAN tests move to an online model.

Year 8 Art Gallery visit to Colours of Impressionism: Masterpieces from the Musée d'Orsay

On Wednesday in Week 1 three Year 8 Visual Art Classes went on an excursion to the Art Gallery of South Australia to see the Colours of Impressionism Exhibition and the Waterhouse Natural Science Art Prize 2018.

The Colours of Impressionism Exhibition includes the work of artists such as Monet, Renoir, Manet, Morisot, Pissarro and Cézanne, among many others. The students were impressed with the paintings and felt it was a really worthwhile experience. They will be following up in class by analysing their favourite paintings and creating some artworks of their own, based on what they saw at the Gallery.

While we were in the city we also had the opportunity to visit the Museum and have a look at the Waterhouse Exhibition. The students found the use of different materials to make art works quite challenging, as they viewed sculptures and images made from a variety of media. Of particular interest, in both exhibitions, was how the works were displayed and we discussed the curatorial aspects and preparations involved in putting on an exhibition.

It was also great to meet up with Ms Sims and her group of Year 11 Art Students while we were in town and we all travelled back together on the bus.
