Attendance

Importance of Regular Attendance

We continue to monitor the attendance of students across junior, middle and senior schools.

The following information is provided to you to emphasise the importance of regular attendance.

Did You Know?

- There is direct correlation between attendance and achievement.
- Frequent absences make it difficult for teachers who have to continually re-teach information and skills.
- Being half an hour late each day from Reception to Year 10 equals missing one year and one and a half terms of schooling.
- Patterns of attendance/absence are set up in the early years of schooling.
- Being absent 5 days per term from Reception to Year 10 adds up to more than one year of missed schooling.
- Students who are frequently absent from school are over represented in the juvenile justice system.
- Poor attendance makes it difficult for students to form positive relationships with their peers.
- Students who are frequently absent from school are more likely to end up homeless.
- Research shows that students who are often absent from school are likely to earn less than their peers as adults.

For the remainder of our students and staff enjoy the break and we look forward to seeing back in Term 4.

THE STARSHIP STOWAWAY ☆

On Thursday 6th September, all Primary classes saw a performance of The Starship Stowaway. In the Drama lesson following the performance, students gave oral feedback. Some classes wrote a written review in class. Here is one from 602.

The Starship Stowaway – Review by Anna Thomas, 602

'The Starship Stowaway' is a play full of entertainment and educational facts for primary years learners which was performed at The Heights School, Senior Art and Drama Room on Tuesday 6th of September. It is based on a non-fictional story of a space explorer named Dr Sarr who was represented by the only performer in the show, Mark. He was ably supported by puppets which made weird sounds and a few other small props. Flip charts created by an artist friend were used superbly as staging and backdrop information giving the young 5-12 years old audience visuals to read as the story was acted out by Dr Sarr the ornithologist.

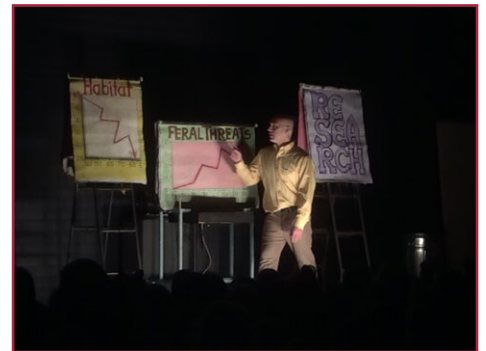
The performance is about Dr Sarr and his hilarious expedition to retain the amount of Plains Wanderer (native desert birds) around Australia, with his friends Eunice and Kylie the Plains Wanderers (puppets). Dr Sarr teaches the audience about food chains and webs plus how and why some native animals became extinct when non Indigenous people settled in Australia. Since cities were constructed and farms built, cows squashed the Plains Wanderer's eggs; feral rabbits ate the native grasses; feral foxes and cats ate the native birds; meaning the desert Plains Wanderer bird population continually became less. When Dr Sarr suggested a scientific recommendation to save these desert native birds that a fence be built around the Woomera Rocket Range the government rejected his recommendation due to it being too costly. He becomes furious and steals a rocket called Starship to see if his male, non-stereotypical bird Kylie could survive a day on Mars. He is accompanied by 'Eunis' a teenager who loves social media. On Mars there is not enough water and food for them so they decide they must make some very extreme decisions to survive on the planet.

Using his skill of voice-change for each character and flip charts for background Dr Sarr was able to make everyone in the audience be filled with joy and laughter. All aspects including exquisite costume, set, model spaceship, planets, puppets and audience involvement added to his unique style of visual theatre to bring this modern tale of high adventure to life made it a show without any bore to spectators. All credit goes to Mark who played the main character of Dr. Sarr. He was creative, enthusiastic and expressive and the only live member of the play. Those who assisted or co-operated with this mesmerizing act had achieved what they had aimed for by leaving the audience with many learning opportunities in Science.

Although, special effects such as video projection and smoke machines weren't included, personal touches together with three colourful lights made it just perfect. The lighting caught everyone's eye with a spotlight used to highlight while the surroundings remained dark. Sound was very projective due to the appropriate echoed environment as well as clear, and well-rehearsed with props in his dialogues which could be easily heard by those even at the very back of the building.

The Starship Stowaway is a thrilling, action adventure story of two space explorers which is most recommended for primary years (F-6). This production takes some creative risks and emphasizes the skills of acting and imagination between the actor and the audience. If there were any chances to improve this presentation it would be to make the background brighter and more detailed. The Heights students from all Primary classes were entertained, educated and learnt a lot about what you do as a scientist like Dr Sarr.

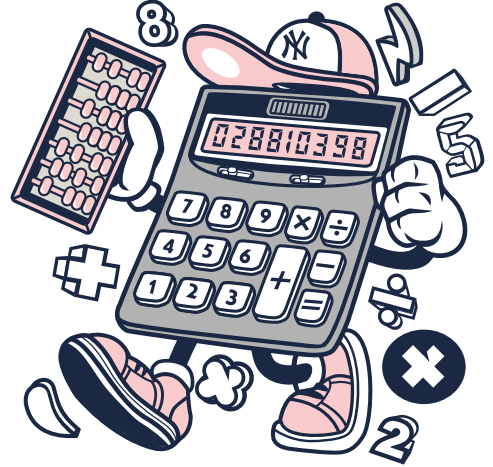

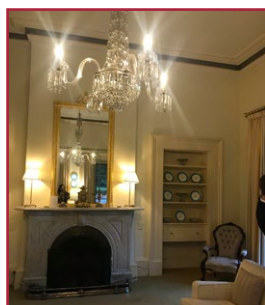

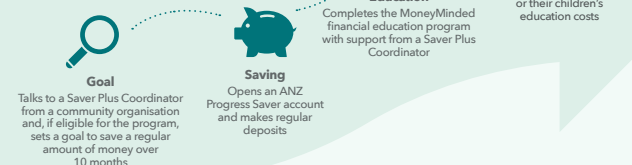
