Welcome to our first newsletter for the 2020 school year at The Heights School.

Congratulations to our 2019 Year 12 students for achieving excellent results. Over the last four years, the Year 12 student groups have consistently achieved the best results at The Heights School for some years, including 4 Merits.

Similar to the previous year 18.43% of all grades were at A grade standard improved from 9.5% in 2015.

55.29% of all grades were at A or B grade standard improved from 51.3% on 2015.

# **AROUND OUR SCHOOL**

#### **NOVEL CORONAVIRUS UPDATE – 2 FEBRUARY 2020**

Public health officials have updated advice over the weekend regarding Novel Coronavirus.

We would like to underline the importance of following this advice and alert you to the new national information hotline 1800 020 080.

The updated advice from SA Health is effective from Saturday I February 2020:

- Children or staff who travelled to mainland China <u>must</u> isolate themselves in their home for 14 days after leaving mainland China if they left mainland China on or after 1 February 2020.
- Children or staff who have been in close contact with a confirmed case <u>must</u> isolate themselves in their homes for 14 days after last contact.
- Children or staff who have returned from Hubei Province, China <u>must</u> isolate themselves in their home for 14 days after leaving Hubei Province.
- Staff and students in these circumstances <u>must not attend</u> schools, preschools or early childhood centres and should not engage with other students.

Symptoms may include fever, cough, shortness of breath, fatigue and sore throat. People with these symptoms who have travelled to China or have had close contact with a confirmed case should see a doctor or attend a hospital and call ahead so they can prepare.

We will keep you updated if new information becomes available.

#### SCHOOL IMMUNISATION PROGRAM

#### IMMUNISATION INFORMATION FOR PARENTS / LEGAL GUARDIANS OF YEAR 8 & 10 STUDENTS

The SA School Immunisation Program will be offered at The Heights School by the City of Tea Tree Gully's Immunisation Clinic.

#### All Year 8 students will be offered:

2 doses of the human papillomavirus vaccine, Gardasil®9 at 2 separate visits.

I dose of the diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough vaccine, Boostrix®

#### All Year 10 students will be offered:

2 doses of the meningococcal B vaccine, Bexsero® at 2 separate visits.

I dose of the meningococcal ACWY vaccine, Nimenrix®

Immunisation consent packs have been sent home with all Year 8 and 10 students. It is important that you read the information contained in the packs before you give consent.

All parents / legal guardians are to complete, sign and return the Consent Cards (even if you do not consent for your student to be vaccinated) and return the form to school by this Friday the 7th of February. Students aged 16 years and above can consent for themselves. If you did not receive an Immunisation Consent pack from your child, please ask at the school office.

If you want your child to receive their vaccinations privately, please contact Tea Tree Gully Immunisation Team on 8397 7444 to arrange for your child to receive the free vaccines at the Clinic. If you go to your local doctor for the vaccination, they will need to order the vaccine and may charge a consultation fee.

Remember to keep your child's School Immunisation Program records in a safe place as they may be required for future employment or travel.

# The Assessment Day for the Ignite Test is Saturday 22nd February 2020

#### Is your son or daughter gifted?

The Ignite Program is a selective entry program for gifted students entering Year 8 at The Heights School. Within the Ignite program there are opportunities for students to be accelerated, and participate in a range of enrichment activities to extend and stimulate their adept minds. They study, and form friendships with other like-minded peers, in a caring and nurturing environment.

Since 2016 our Year 12 students have repeatedly achieved near 20% A grades. In 2019 34% of our Year 12 students achieved an ATAR of above 80. Our highest ATAR score in 2019 was 99.95 for a student who was also participating in the Headstart Program at the University of Adelaide as part of our Ignite Program.

In 2019, 98% of students who applied for university positions were offered their first or second preference. The Heights School is continuing to work with universities to provide valuable links, pathways and opportunities.





#### Supporting Aboriginal young people to navigate pathways

The Workabout Centre supports Aboriginal young people to move between study and employment.



For many Aboriginal young people, finding a job isn't always easy or straight forward, even once they have attained the skills or qualifications for their chosen career path.

The Workabout Centre offers the 'Playing the Job Game' program to help young people transition from school to working life. Played in 5 easy steps, each step prepares students for a first experience in the workplace and/or training environment.

#### 5-Steps to Work Readiness

Each of the 5 Steps is designed to help students gain the entry-level employability skills and knowledge that employers and training providers expect.

The 5-STEPS to Work Readiness program can be accredited and on successful completion, students may receive up to 10 Stage 1 SACE credits. The program can also be linked to a student's Personal Learning Plan (PLP).

#### **Student-centred learning** - how can we help you?

Student-centered learning empowers students to make positive choices, set high expectations and plan achievable training and employment goals.

Each student's individual training plan will focus on how they will 'play the job game', access training and ultimately achieve their goals!
