LOST ITEMS

We recognise it is inevitable that items will be misplaced by students. To assist in reuniting lost items with their owner we would like to highlight the importance of clear labelling with students full name and current class on all items.

Lost property will be located in a central collection point;

- Primary years; the corridor outside the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen
- Secondary years; under the stairwell in M building

Students are encouraged to take responsibility for their own belongings and if missing check appropriate collection areas throughout the school day. Parents seeking lost items should check the lost property before school (8:40am – 8:55am) or after school (3.05pm – 3.30pm) to claim items.

Unclaimed but labelled items will be returned to their rightful owners after each clean-up of the lost property. At the end of each term any unclaimed uniform items in good condition will be utilised by the school and all non-uniform items in good condition will be donated to a local charity.



STAGE 2 FOOD AND HOSPITALITY SOUP DRIVE

It gave us great pleasure again this year to help the Pathways Community Centre, located on Milne Rd at Modbury, in providing fresh soup to their many clients. Unfortunately, unlike last year due to COVID-19 restrictions the students were unable to visit the Community Centre and serve the soup, so the soup was delivered in microwave safe containers for easy transportation and distribution. The focus of the day was to create nutritious soups for a community group while also considering food sustainability.

Pathways Community Centre does an amazing job in our community. Last year the Centre served around 120-150 families with fresh food items, however since March this year an extra 1000 families in our area have registered for food hampers. In total, the students made 43 litres of heartwarming soups, ranging from traditional chicken and vegetable made by Shane, Kehan and Max, to a delicious roasted capsicum soup prepared by Claudia and Minuka.

Even though the students were unable to serve the soup, they should be immensely proud of their efforts in supporting an important and crucial community initiative. Mrs Kaye Flack, Executive Assistant at the centre expressed her appreciation and eagerly handed out the soup as soon as it was delivered.

3. If works are framed they must include a wire or hook to hang them from.
4. You can offer your art works for sale but any work sold must remain on display until the exhibition closes.
5. The judging panel consists of Nigel Gill – Principal, Vicki Cook – Business Manager and Catherine Bourn – Artist and Art Teacher.
6. The judges' decision will be final and no correspondence will be entered into.
7. The winning entry will be chosen according to the following criteria.
 - a. Creativity and originality
 - b. Sensitivity and skill in use of media
 - c. Presentation
8. Winners will be announced in the venue on Monday 3rd August between 5pm and 7pm.
