




Thank you to all the students who have completed their Challenge for 2021.


Students are encouraged to continually record their books during the year. Extra sheets are available from the Library, teachers or online at:




STAGE 1 OUTDOOR EDUCATION

The Stage I Outdoor Education class has been busy over the first weeks of the semester, completing two rock-climbing experiences and achieving the Apply First Aid certificate.

We have had two visits to Vertical Reality Climbing Centre, and the class has developed skills in climbing, belaying and bouldering. It has been awesome to see students challenging themselves on harder routes and developing persistence to keep attempting climbs that have been difficult. Students will now complete a reflection task on their planning, preparation and experiences climbing.

Furthermore, students took part in the HLTH003 Apply First Aid training and were successful in gaining their certificates. Students now have a vast number of skills in differing first aid situations. Not only will this be essential in our bushwalking journey next term, but is transferable to many current and future jobs. Thanks to FirstAid Pro for facilitating our course.
