A MESSAGE TO PARENTS AND CAREGIVERS FROM

Professor Nicola Spurrier, Chief Public Health Officer



Dear parents and caregivers,

The COVID-19 pandemic has been a worrying time for all of us.

The Delta COVID-19 variant is twice as infectious as the original COVID-19 strain and there are now more cases in children and young people.

Vaccination is the best way to protect you, your family, and your friends from getting sick, and reduce the risk of outbreaks and school closures.

I encourage everyone aged 12 years and over in your household to get vaccinated against COVID-19 as soon as possible.

COVID-19 vaccines in Australia are safe and many millions of Australians are already protected.

The Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI) has recommended both the Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines for people aged 12 years and over in Australia.

Consent from a parent/caregiver for COVID-19 vaccination is required for anyone under the age of 16.

LOST ITEMS

We recognise it is inevitable that items will be misplaced by students. To assist in reuniting lost items with their owner we would like to highlight the importance of clear labelling with the student's full name and current class on all items.

Lost property will be located in a central collection point;

- Primary years; the corridor outside the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen
- · Secondary years; under the stairwell in M building

Students are encouraged to take responsibility for their own belongings and if missing check appropriate collection areas throughout the school day. Parents seeking lost items should check the lost property before school (8:40am - 8:55am) or after school (3.05pm - 3.30pm) to claim items.

Unclaimed but labelled items will be returned to their rightful owners after each clean-up of the lost property. At the end of each term any unclaimed uniform items in good condition will be utilised by the school and all non-uniform items in good condition will be donated to a local charity.

RECEPTION SCIENCE - KAURNA SEASONS

In Science last term, Reception students learnt about the weather and how it impacts what we might wear, activities we might do and food we might eat.

As a part of this learning about weather, Reception students focused on the seasons and what the common weather patterns might be for each one. To enrich this learning, they looked at the Kaurna seasons and how the Kaurna people observe the land and sky to know what season it is.

Students learnt about what clothes, activities and food are most common in each season and then they chose their favourite and illustrated something that might happen in that particular season.

Mrs Goerner then bound their illustrations into a book so that this information could be shared with other early years classes.
