PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Student and Staff Absence

We have been managing well with student and staff absence due to COVID over the past several weeks. Up until last week we have only had a handful of staff away and less than 10 students per day.

I am very proud of our staff, everyone present is picking up extra work for programs to run as close to normal as possible. If absences continue to increase we may need to make modifications and cancel activities and excursions that take staff out of school as we won't be able to have enough staff to cover them. So far so good though.

Also a big acknowledgement to our parents, for working with us and our many communications involved with these matters.

Your support with this, as well as keeping your child home when unwell is both essential and appreciated.

2022 Improvement Plan

Towards the end of last year we developed the new School Improvement Plan 2022-2024. It has a continued literacy, numeracy and high achievement focus.

The three goals are:

- High Band Achievement in Reading
- High Band Achievement in Numeracy
- Increasing the percentage of A and B grades at Year 12

We continue to focus on increasing the percentage of children in the high bands in literacy and numeracy by Year 3 and retaining and supporting more students to reach these levels in the years to follow. In the high school years we are looking for higher levels of achievement in subject grades, especially Year 12.

Sports Day

Our Sports Day was held on Friday 11th March. Congratulations to all involved. Although parents weren't physically present there was some live streaming and a fun day was had by all involved. Thank you to the local Lions Club for providing a great barbecue service that was enjoyed by many. Once again, participation, support, encouragement and a great atmosphere was present.

In Visual Art, 703 have been creating a range of visual artworks surrounding the theme of 'food'. Students have been developing their understandings of line, shape, tone and colour,


applying their understanding of the elements of art to create amazing final products. Most recently students have developed 'reverse tonal drawings' using black paper and white pencil. Don't they look great!




YEAR 9 GRAPHIC DESIGN - MAGAZINE FRONT COVER DESIGNS























YEAR 10 ANIMAL CAMOUFLAGE
