IMPORTANT MESSAGE FOR ALL FAMILIES

We have an increasing number of both primary and secondary school students arriving for school from 7.30am. Please note that as supervision for students begins at 8.25am Monday-Friday, we request that students do not arrive at school before this time and students on site without supervision is a safety concern.

Yard duty supervision in play areas finishes at 2.50pm on Mondays and 3.25pm on Tuesdays-Fridays. The Resource Centre is open just before and just after school times for students to borrow and return books and laptops only with the exception of students

participating in scheduled supervised after school activities. The Resource Centre is not a supervised area of the school for students to spend time in before and after school.

Please make arrangements to have your children collected by the conclusion of yard duty supervision or speak with our Out of School Hours Care Service to arrange enrolment if you need care for your primary school aged children outside these times. Leaving children on site without supervision is a safety issue and we would like to ask for your assistance in ensuring the best care for your child.

NAIDOC WEEK

NAIDOC Week is an opportunity for all Australians to learn about First Nations cultures and histories and participate in celebrations of the oldest, continuous living cultures on Earth.

NAIDOC WEEK AT THE HEIGHTS

Starting on Monday, all students at The Heights School learnt about the importance of NAIDOC Week and engaged in different tasks where they had the opportunity to discover the history and achievements of Aboriginal Australians.

Mrs Di Troia's Year 4 class started the week by conducting their own acknowledgement ceremony in class and spoke about the significance of Welcome to Country. Miss Yeomans's Year 4 class, made and ate traditional damper with a variety of bush jams and chutneys.


807, Mr Barmby's class, learnt about the achievements of some famous Aboriginal Australians and the impact they have had on modern day Australia in the fields of politics, sport, art, engineering and literature. People such as, David Unaipon, Vincent Lingiari, Neville Bonner and Shirley Colleen Smith to name a few.

Year 10 students learnt about the frontier wars and how Aboriginal people fought, stood up for their rights and went about creating equality. At lunchtime, Mr Brzezinski and Aaron set up a colouring-in station where students could colour in Indigenous art.

Year 6 teacher, Mrs Goldstone, used the theme of "Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up!" to allow students to express their artistic side by creating a poster. The poster had to include the current theme and its meaning, what NAIDOC stands for and why we celebrate it and both the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flags. The BBQ was organised to celebrate the achievements of Aboriginal people and also for students and staff to experience some traditional Aboriginal food and spices.

Dimitra and Michael opened the BBQ with a Welcome to Country where over 75 staff and students attended.

Students and staff were able to eat kangaroo sausages with traditional jams and chutneys and kangaroo tail cooked over charcoals with traditional seasonings of lemon myrtle and wattle seed. Bush tea was also available to drink.

Special thanks to Aaron who organised and managed the BBQ, Zoes for cooking and bringing in his charcoal BBQ from home, Irini for

making the bush tea and helping organise, and to Bec, Jess, Eva, Eve, Justin and Daniel for helping set up, pack up and making the experience enjoyable for all.


