## **MURIEL MATTERS AWARD**

On Tuesday 29th of November, Gabbi Colloff a Year 12 graduate in 2022 was presented with the Muriel Matters Award. The Muriel Matters Awards program was established in 2021. The award program is for schools with secondary enrolments and is conducted under the guidance of the Speaker of the House of Assembly and the Minister for Education. The awards have been developed to acknowledge the trail blazing work and life of Muriel Matters, the South Australianborn suffragist, educator and social reformer.

The awards are to be conducted annually for Department for Education, Catholic Education and Independent schools and managed by the Department for Education.

#### ADF Year 10 Awards

This year, the awards were presented by former ADF member and Governing Council Chairperson, Mr Jim Rouse, on behalf of the Australian Defence Force.

#### ADF Long Tan Leadership and Teamwork Award - Year 10

The Long Tan Award is presented annually to a student who demonstrates leadership and teamwork within both the school and the broader local community. At the same time, it recognises those who display strong values such as doing one's best, respect for others and 'mateship', characteristics that are integral to Australian society.

The award is named after the Battle of Long Tan, during the Vietnam War and is a fitting tribute to the Long Tan veterans, for the very traits they demonstrated such as determination, mateship, teamwork, tenacity, compassion and leadership.

#### Award Winner: Jack Matteucci - Year 10

Jack is an Aboriginal student currently studying in Year 10. As a highly gifted student Jack was accepted into the Heights Schools Ignite program and has excelled in his studies this year, obtaining very high grades. He also volunteers regularly with our Ab Ed department, but especially for the significant NAIDOC and Reconciliation week events.

Jack has a goal of becoming a professional soccer player or becoming a teacher with a focus on Aboriginal Education and PE. While Jack devotes a lot of time to study he is also an extremely good soccer player and is currently the under 15's Goal keeper for Metrostars in the under 17s JSL side. Through his soccer team he will travel to England and train with several English Premier League clubs at the end of 2022.

This year Jack was selected in the SAASTA, Aboriginal Football Academy - a sports-based education program for Aboriginal Students. Jack attends St Clair Recreation Centre once a week throughout the school year, during which he participates in a SACE/VET subject as well as a targeted football development program with coaches from MetroStars Soccer Club. He travelled as part of the South Australian Indigenous Football Squad and played at the Gold Coast in October this year.

Last term the SAASTA Specialist Academies had the privilege to connect with community leader Adam Goodes where Jack was able to have a conversation with Adam about identity, racism, leadership and elite sports. Jack is a big inspiration to our community here at The Heights School. Jack has become the spokesperson for the secondary Aboriginal student cohort and volunteers his time throughout the year to help promote Aboriginal perspective and culture in our school community. It is great to see a young person put in such hard work and really excel in their chosen fields.

#### ADF Future Innovators Award - Year 10

This award recognises student achievements in STEM in 2022. The ADF are presenting this award to encourage the next generation of innovators, critical thinkers and problem solvers; bright Australian students who are succeeding in STEM subjects. Achievement in STEM opens up a range of exciting opportunities which can help to shape our Nation's future. This award, acknowledges students who demonstrate innovation and learning in the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics.

#### Award Winner: Angelpreet Kaur - Year 10

Angelpreet is a highly motivated student who has maintained a high academic standard throughout school. She is determined to attain the best results that she is capable of and is prepared to work extremely hard in order to reach her goals. Her resilience and self-determination highlight her personality, and she is to be commended on her outstanding efforts.

Angelpreet's mentorship to STEM students and her participation in various STEM projects has earned the respect of her peers, teachers and the school's leadership team. Her focus to assist and extend students with their problem solving skills has improved her own critical thinking talents and has enabled her to become an independent learner.

#### Governing Council Equity and Respect Awards

#### Award Winner: Manuth Chandrasena - Year 9

Manuth's friendly and considerate nature is demonstrated consistently when interacting with his peers and teachers. He is kind, courteous, polite, and is always willing to help everyone. Manuth has an excellent work ethic, always works hard in his studies, takes pride in his sport, and his personal growth. #### Isambard Brunel STEM Achievement Awards

The Isambard Brunel STEM Achievement Awards are sponsored by the Hon Mr Blair Boyer MP, Member for Wright -Minister for Education, Training & Skills. It acknowledge two students, one in years 7-9 and the other in years 10-12 who have displayed outstanding commitment to and achievement in the study of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths). This year the awards were presented by Adam Duncan on behalf of Mr Blair Boyer.

As well as having his name on the street our school is situated upon, the famous engineer Isambard Kingdom Brunel, played a key role in Britain's industrial revolution, designing and constructing railway lines, bridges, tunnels and docks around the country, as well as providing massive advances in naval architecture. It is fitting that our STEM award is named after him also.

#### Award Winner: Riwoo Jung - Year 8

Riwoo has an inquring, curious mindset. He has been prepared to think analytically and with creativity, producing some exceptional work products in Year8 Science this year. His inventive paper model explaining a non-Newtonian fluid was insightful and elegant in its construction and movement. The complex engineering required to produce a 3D poster, mimicking the splitting of a nucleus to produce Nuclear Energy, was genius. Riwoo has displayed all the attributes that make him a worthy recipient of this STEM award.

#### Award Winner: Vatsal Thakkar - Year 11

Vatsal has continued to demonstrate outstanding commitment and achievement in the study of STEM as demonstrated by his many areas of involvement. These include: Excelling in year 12 physics which he studied as an accelerated subject this year. Achieving consistently high grades for his Year 11 Maths and Science subjects in 2022, involvement in the REA Subs in Schools Competition in 2021 where the team came second, involvement in the 2021 REA Subs in School National Final held earlier this year in which the team came third and mentoring students for The Heights School Teams in the 2022 REA Subs in School Challenge, the University of South Australia Year 10 STEMIE challenge, and the Year 9 IGNITE STEM challenge. Vatsal is currently working in a team on a sophisticated entry for the 2023 Oliphant Science Award. Vatsal is excited and enthused by studies and challenges in STEM and a deserving recipient of this award.
