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MOBILE PHONE POLICY

Thank you for your continued support of the Department for Education's (DfE) mobile phone and personal device policy. As a school community, we truly value the focus on teaching and learning that this policy allows, where students are free of electronic distractions in their lesson time.

Unfortunately, we have been receiving increasing reports of student mobile phone use. This includes phones being used before school, in lesson time, during break times and as a personal 'hot spot'.

The use of 'hot spots' is of particular concern as this allows students to bypass the department's network filters whilst at school.

In home group time this week, students will be reminded of our whole school policy and be asked to show their mobile devices are locked away for the day. If your child does not have their own

mobile device, please reach out to their home group teacher. We ask that you remind your children to lock their turned off phones, and secure them in their Yondr pouch as soon as they enter school at the start of the day.

April Vacation Care is fast approaching and bookings are now open! We have put forward a fantastic schedule with many fun and engaging experiences for the children. For the first time The Heights OSHC will also be operating Preschool Vacation Care.

It's been great to see many new families enrolling into the Service for 2024. It's in our best interest that we support families with their transition as we endeavour to create a space that is safe for all. In saying that we have some reminders and updates that we trust will be helpful to new and existing families.

- For families dropping off in Before School Care, remember that our service does not commence operations until 7:00am. Moving forward, the front gate on Brunel Drive will not be opened until approximately 6:58am. There will be no entry to the car park prior to this time.
- Breakfast at OSHC concludes at 8:00am. If you are dropping off at 8:00am or later, breakfast will not be offered. Ideally children should have eaten breakfast before they arrive at OSHC.
- Children must be signed in/out via the iPad by a parent or guardian listed as an authorised contact. If you have any issues with your Digital PIN or would like to update contacts please notify the Service.

RECEPTION CLASS R03: OUR JOURNEY INTO RECEPTION

In R03, we have been embarking on an exciting journey as brand new Reception students! Over the past few weeks we have been listening to stories about starting school and connecting these books to our own experiences.

One of the important lessons we've learned is that everyone feels differently about new experiences, especially starting school. We've had discussions about the range of emotions we might feel – from excitement and bravery to nervousness and worry. We've come to understand that it's perfectly okay to have different feelings, and that each feeling is valid and important.

Our exploration of emotions has seamlessly connected to our Zones of Regulation curriculum. We've been learning about the importance of social and emotional skills and identifying which "zone" we might be in at different times. Through vocabulary that I've targeted in these books (worried, brave, excited, nervous, confident, and proud) we've been able to express and explore our feelings in relation to starting school.

The past few weeks have been filled with a rollercoaster of emotions but we've also realised just how proud we are of our achievements in our first few weeks of school.

Teen Parliament

Across the state, only 30 students have been chosen to represent the youth of South Australia at Parliament House on March 8.
